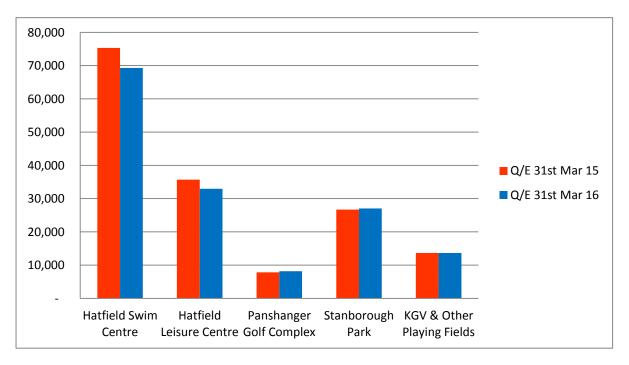
## Fourth Quarter 2015-16

# 1. <u>Visitor Numbers</u>

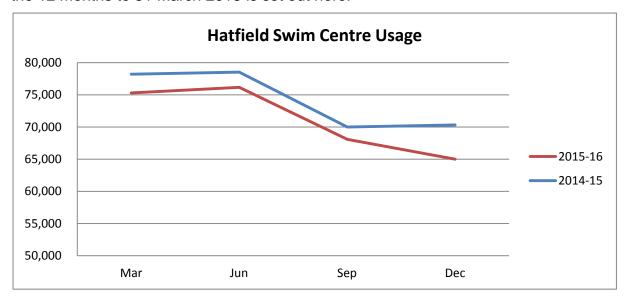

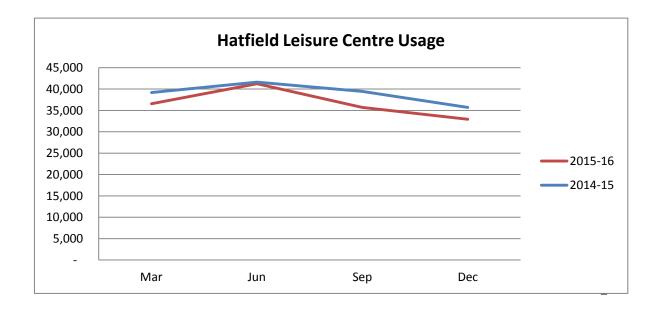
A graph for each managed site showing the attendance levels for each quarter in the 12 months to 31 March 2016 is set out here:



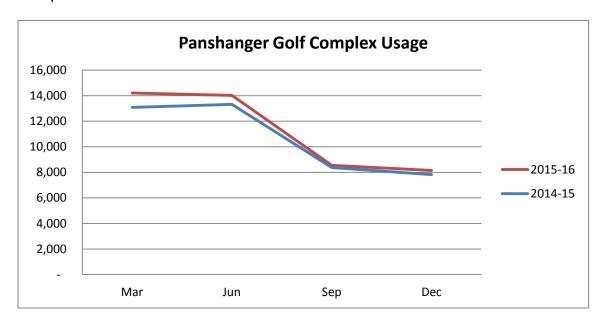
Finesse accommodated over 740,000 visits across the various sites during 2015-16, with over 37% attending the Hatfield Swim Centre.

The attendance for the fourth quarter of 2015-16 at the Swim Centre totalled nearly 70,000 visits, down compared to the fourth quarter of 2014-15 by 8%. The downturn continues to be the result of lost memberships to the low cost gyms in Hatfield. The Finesse Executive Team, along with the Board are considering proposals to refurbish the gym areas at both the Swim and Leisure Centre, to include a separate spin studio that is currently being delivered on the gym floor. It will also include new flooring, painting and functional equipment to bring the areas more in line with the local competition.

Swimming usage was higher in the fourth quarter of 2015-16 compared to the same 3 months of 2014-15 by 5%. 80 additional children have joined the swimming lesson programme in the quarter.

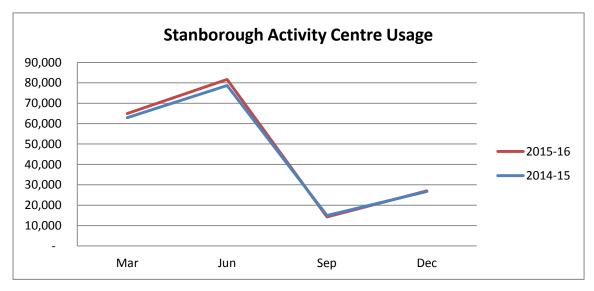


The recorded attendance at Hatfield Leisure Centre for the fourth quarter of 2015-16 amounted to nearly 33,000 visits, over 140,000 in the year but is down 7.7% compared to the fourth quarter of 2014-15. As with the Swim Centre, the downturn is a result of lower fitness members and capital investments are being considered to improve the facilities.



Panshanger Golf Complex attendance has increased by 4% compared to the fourth quarter of 2014-15. The attendance in the last 12 months amounts to nearly 45,000, which is 5.5% more than the 12 months ending 31 March 2015.

Casual usage continues to be variable and is very dependent on weather conditions but golf memberships, footgolf and secondary spend such as resale and hire of golf buggies have contributed to the overall success in the year.



Stanborough Park attendance has increased slightly compared to the fourth quarter of 2014-15 with nearly 188,000 visitors in the last 12 months.

The usage at King George V and other playing fields has increased slightly compared to the fourth quarter of 2014-15. The aerobics sessions and boot camp activities continue to contribute to the increase in participation.

Despite not achieving the income targets set for the fourth quarter, the financial outturn was £33,000 better than budget mainly due to £80,000 of cost savings. There was also a difference in the Management Fee reporting due to a budgeting error. Finesse had come to the end of a 10 year repayment plan with the Council for investment in the Swim and Leisure Centre gyms, however this had not been reflected in the budgeted management fee.

Also included in the financial accounts is a payment of £44,000 for the balance of the 2015-16 revenue savings made to the Council in the year. The Council required £150,000 in savings of which £106,000 was identified as a permanent deduction. The balance of £44,000 was paid from surpluses generated in the year.

### 2. <u>Latest News, Improvements and Initiatives</u>

- Finesse has completed a restructure of the Management Teams at Hatfield Swim Centre and Hatfield Leisure Centre and welcomed two new General Managers to the business. The General Managers will report directly into the Director of Operations and are accountable for all aspects of the sites performance
- Finesse has been working with their partner APCOA on the new car parking facilities at Stanborough Activity Centre and will be fully implemented by the end of June. The new ANPR camera system will allow for 24 hour, time banding pricing, along with varying payment methods including cash, card, phone and season tickets.

The residents parking charges remain at £1.50 per visit, any day for any amount of time. At the time of writing, a communication plan is being prepared to fully inform residents of Welwyn Hatfield about the changes and how to register their vehicle to benefit from the lower rate.

Non resident parking charges have been set to better reflect the use of the park and the other parking charges across the Borough. The rates have been set as follows:

Up to 1 hour £1.50 Up to 3 hours £3.50 Over 3 hours £5.00

There is also a 20 minute 'drop off' grace period for customers participating in other paid activities in the park.

- Hatfield Leisure Centre hosted an event for the Herts Disability Sports
  Hub in April. The all day tea dance was held in the Main Hall and Dance
  Studio. There were over 100 people in attendance and the event was
  very well received.
- Hertfordshire County Council's Countryside Management Service is hosting the county's first Walking Festival throughout May this year across the Finesse sites. The Festival is set to be an exciting and fun event, with a diverse collaboration of outdoor activities and pursuits, bringing together a range of local organisations. The varied walks include nature trails, local history walks, mass Health Walk (16th May), dawn chorus events, singing jaunts and photography
