Although I begrudgingly accept the general features of the parking scheme, I feel strongly that the 8am to 6pm effective hours is too long and would like a reduction in the hours (preferably to 1 hour). This would still penalise un-invited non-residents (like commuters) that park for extended periods, whilst allowing keeping the freedom for residents to have friends and families over.

Separately, I would like to log 2 complaints around the manner in which the consultation has proceeded.

- 1. The signs put up along the road during the objection period read like a formal terms and conditions, and not a document that encourages reading and understanding. Furthermore large parts of the scheme are on the back of the notice and not visible when mounted on a lamp-post.
- 2. The low response rate to the survey could probably be explained by the 2 letters being addressed "Dear Occupier". This term is usually used in junk mail and does not encourage engagement. Equally the area normally receive these notices when the railways are doing railworks, and quite often end up with the Junk Mail, in the bin.

I think the proposed scheme should be properly explained and easy to understand.

While I understand there are some parking issues in the area the proposed scheme will have more of a negative effect on the lives of residents than the parking issue itself. I am single parent, and a carer for my Autistic daughter. This does mean that I sometimes have to rely on the support of family and friends to help me and my daughter. I do not have a drive and can not afford to pay for the annual parking permit for myself let alone the visitor permits I would need in order for me to continue to have the support system I rely on.

A shorter 1 hour parking restriction midday would surely be just as effective at deterring the non resident commuter parking issue without having such a negative effect on the residents.

Dear Mr Reyner

We are writing to register our objection to the parking proposals for Peartree Area 1. Although we agree with the proposal to protect the verges and footways detailed in the verge protection order plans, we strongly object to introducing a residents parking scheme.

We are in favour of stopping commuters and workers of the Broadwater Road development sites parking and blocking our road during the day in the working week. The introduction of a 1 hour restriction (10am-11am) would prevent this, but would also penalise residents of the properties who do not have off road parking or work un-sociable hours or nights shifts when they cannot take their vehicles off the carriageway. Many of the residents have carers, hairdressers, cleaners and other short term visitors who under your proposals would require daily passes which seems unfair.

We have investigated other areas near to the town centre and many of these do not have as many residents requiring roadside parking as the Peartree area 1 which is less affluent than many of those on the west side of the railway line. Specifically the Sherrards Park area; many of the properties have large off road parking so do not need to park on the road, yet this area has parking restrictions for 2 hours Monday to Saturday. This appears to show more favour to the west side of town as is a popular view amongst many of the residents to the East of the railway line.

As pointed out in the previous paragraphs, the less affluent area East of the town appears to be taxed more for living close to the town centre and having essential visitors than those to the West.

Could you please provide us with a copy of the original survey and the numbers in reply to each of the options? We personally replied to the initial survey requesting not to impose parking permits. It is a strong possibility some residents of Peartree Area 1 did not appreciate that to have permits would involve a cost many cannot afford.

Please could you also explain how the option of parking restrictions being proposed is Monday-Saturday when the majority of replies were evenly split between Monday-Friday and Monday-Sunday. This seems to be against the democratic nature of our country and is akin to holding a general election with both the Conservative and Labour parties gaining an equal share of the majority of votes but as they were equal the Liberal Democrats are chosen to govern the company even though they received much fewer votes than the other 2. It would have made more sense to go with the lesser option of Monday to Friday allowing resident to be able to park freely at the weekends and have visitors when the builders and commuters are not an issue in the area

I am emailing is response to the planned Peartree 1 Parking Scheme. The prospect of permitted parking being introduced in the area is nothing shy of idiocy. I fail to see who really benefits from this idea but, it is absolutely not the residents of the area; of which I am. I live in a household with several drivers are cars, all of which require their vehicles to get to and from work. Two of these people are female key workers and I for one, do not expect them to use public transport alone in the dark winter months, then walking home with the local ASBO army strutting around uncontrolled. That and have you seen the cost of public transport. I work in London and as we are not in the Oyster Zone, it's around £24 a day for a return to LKX, then and additional £13.50 on the tube. £37.50 a day just to get to and from work is ridiculous by anyones standards. And that's just mean. This is why people need cars, it's significantly more cost effective and more relaiable as far as time goes.

The proposed idea will not only affect residents, it also affects visitors and healthcare workers trying to see and/or assist the elderly. It seems in very bad taste that after the last 2 years of isolation, you have chosen now to essentially restrict people visiting family and friends. I think there are at least 2 better options off the top of my head. These 2 ideas took very little thought but I believe will do more then simply line a few pockets.

- 1) We introduce a 1 hour restriction at peak time 9-10am ish. This will mean that the majority of cars will likely be at work but will also prevent non-residents parking in the area, then walking to the local train station. This however still presents a problem to anybody on annual leave, maternity or who is simply unwell for a day or working from home.
- 2) Ask residents to register their cars at each address and give each resident's registered vehicle a free permit. This means that multiple car families won't have to wake up and go for a random drive for an hour to avoid a fine. I'd like to add, these random drives will waste money, fuel and are anything but environmental friendly.

Both these suggestions seem to benefit the residents and will help manage the situation. I'm aware that I'm not the only resident in the area that has taken this proposed lunicity badly. It begs the question as to why council tax keeps going up. You now want us to pay to park ours cars, at our homes, that we need to go to work in order to pay for said permit, the rent and council tax. It's pretty outrageous when you stop and actually think about it. Please do your jobs and be a council for the people and do what the people want.
