				The ASB may be as a result of mental health issues. We will work with the perpetrators to help them but if they do not engage we will take further action

				against them or their tenancy. The perpetrator may not qualify for help as they do not meet the criteria for a particular agency. The perpetrator may not be able to understand and remember what is expected from them as a tenant or what is being said to them. They also may not have the ability to change their behaviour because of their mental health needs. A better relationship with the Mental Health Team is being developed to overcome this.
