Figure 1. Action status





Figure 2. Theme/Impact area

| Comments | The Landscape Management Plan for Singlers Marsh and Danesbury Park are due for renewal. The drafts plans have been approved at Cabinet and have been out to consultation. Overall the consultation responses were positive with 85% of respondents agreeing with the Visions and objectives. Some factual issues have been amended following responses and the amended plans are going to Cabinet for final approval in February. | | |

4. Climate Audit

- 4.1 HCC recently conducted an audit on our climate change strategy and action plan. They were satisfied with their findings in terms of our internal governance, reporting, strategy and action plan.
- 4.2 They had no recommendations or actions.

5. Climate Action Survey Results

- 5.1 The community climate action survey ran from $6^{th} 30^{th}$ November.
- 5.2 A lucky respondent was sent her £30 electronic gift car for RSPB.
- 5.3 A full report has been sent with the supporting documents, however a summary of key findings are;
 - 678 respondents
 - The largest proportion of respondents were in the age range 25- 34 (35%)
 - 346 wanted to sign up to a climate e bulletin
 - The main action people take to address climate change is to reduce their meat intake, followed by walking or cycling frequently.
 - When asked to identify what motivates these lifestyle choice, (respondents could chose more than one option), the most popular answer was to improve the natural environment (63%), followed by reducing emissions (36%), increasing resilience to the impacts of climate change (35%), health and wellbeing improvement (32%), improving air quality (25%), financial savings (22%) because someone they know does it (8%).
 - Provided lots of ideas on how we can support residents in achieving their own climate aspirations and help us achieve our boroughwide net zero target.

6. WHBC Climate Hub

- 6.1 The Climate Hub is designed to facilitate action 18. (Develop and implement on and offline mechanisms through which residents, businesses and stakeholders can be involved in the progress and delivery of the CAP).
- 6.2 The Climate Hub Logo has been approved and we are working towards launching this early in the next financial year, which will be well timed to promote when we host some in person events. For instance, we hope to have a WHBC Climate Hub stall at the BID's vegan market on 9th March and we are looking to facilitate a number of events to celebrate the Great Big Green Week (8th 16th June).
- 6.3 We are being mindful to piggyback upon existing relevant planned events to avoid creating extra work for ourselves and to broaden the impact of events.
- 6.4 We will utilise existing partnerships to avoid duplication of events and have begun reaching out to new community eco groups that we can work with in future.

7. AOB (other progress updates)

- 7.1 Transition to Net Zero document is well underway, hoping to be able to share the first draft by the end of this financial year.
- 7.2 Wenta programme has 29 business registered to date.
- 7.3 Solar Together second cohort had 398 registrations of interest.
- 7.4 HUG 2 has had approximately 10 referrals come through to date.
- 7.5 Just before Christmas we were awarded £3,000 from the Towards Net Zero Carbon funding scheme (from SHARE Museums East) to upgrade the lighting in Mill Green Museum to LED's. Work will be commencing shortly.
