
## Q1 Do you use or visit the open space/nature reserve?



(4) I object to the provision of fencing to the Mimram in Singlers Marsh CW3b as this will have an adverse impact the open vista and access to the river. This is of particular restrictive to children's learning of the river and creatures that inhabit the river and its banks. (5) I disagree with the provision of surfaced paths & board walks CW7b as this wall also have an adverse impact on a natural open space. Also I do feel it might have been better to do Singlers Marsh and Danesbury separately as they are VERY different places. Hopefully you will be able to read all my comments. Danesbury Mgt Plan notes On the map on page 110 the names of roads are wrong - Roman Rd should be St Johns Close and St Johns Close should be North Ride There is a butterfly transect that is walked (started by Pat Watt now walked by me) on Danesbury reserves for UKBMS - mainly Park Field which has been going for over 20 years now. UKBMS have all the data. Also recorded on Danesbury - purple hairstreak, silver washed fritillary, dark green fritillary and brown argus. This has been done every year except this year but will recommence next year. Fungi surveys have been done in the past (by Pat Watt). Waxcaps were common on Fernery field, but not seen so much now. There is a yearly abundance of parasol mushrooms in large rings across the fernery field. With regard to birds, red kites should also be mentioned, and buzzard, tawny owls, green woodpecker, tree creeper and kestrel. With regard to flowers orchids have been seen on Park Field near the pond - common spotted and pyramidal. Also

snakes head fritillary. Cowslips are starting to proliferate a bit more. Bee orchids have been

seen on suburban roadsides adjacent to Park Field. With regard to mammals evidence of badgers have been seen in the past, also fox and muntiac deer. Also shrews, probably common. With regard to reptiles, grass snakes and slow worms have definitely been seen around the reserve within the last few years. With regard to insects, please mention the ant hills! They are pretty ancient and VERY important for the green woodpeckers especially. The plan does not mention tree planting once! Apart from the possibility of a new hedge to replace the cherry laurel which I think is a very good idea. Also there are some dead trees within fenced enclosures on both fields - can these be replaced? Some of the thriving trees within those fences are quite mature now and maybe do not need protecting? Can the enclosures be dismantled and used to surround new planting? Volunteers can water, mulch and care for these as they do in the fernery. Also some wildflower planting? Waiting to see what can turn up is fine but I think we can help this process along by planting yellow rattle first (in some areas) to inhibit grass growth and then plant native flowers. Once planted in one area hopefully these will spread to other areas in a more natural way. The ragwort pulling parties will continue next year as they have started this year. I am happy to organise as I don't really want to have any spraying on the reserves. Singlers Marsh Mgt Plan notes Bird species also present include grey heron, kingfisher, little egret, barn owl and tawny owl. Wet mud will also encourage populations of house martins. Mammals also include shrews, foxes and moles (even though it must be really damp down there!). Singlers Marsh is still being monitored for river fly for the River fly Partnership. I know this because they do it in my back garden! Again no mention of tree planting? Repairing and filling in hedgerows on the boundaries with Kimpton Road and Fulling Mill Lane could also be considered? Also wildflowers? There are good abundances of a small amount of species but there are other things which could be planted to encourage them to spread - water figwort for instance and also more planting in the river - water crowfoot and iris pseudacorus? The footpath that runs by the northern boundary by the pumping station enclosure is often flooded and muddy causing people to walk very close to the barbed wire perimeter fence (behind the large weeping willow). A boardwalk has been suggested (crossing in front of the willow) which would allow for crossing the muddy section and give visitors a good view of the marshy land and habitat. This is something the Wednesday volunteers could undertake as there is normally a large number of volunteers on these days. Even if that cannot be achieved because of lack of funds, something needs to be done about the pathway there as it is guite dangerous at present in the winter months. AM5 page 172 grass cutting schedule is copied from the Danesbury mgt plan... Litter picking can be (and is often) included in the WRAG group who pick once a month on the third Sunday? This will save money for the council who won't have to undertake this task. For both reserve areas it would be good to have a regular survey of; Trees/ mammals/birds/flowers/reptiles/insects/butterflies (already done)/moths etc. for records and to see whether trends are going up or down.


