### SALE OF NEWSPAPER CONSORTIUM

### 1 <u>Executive Summary</u>

1.1 Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council is the lead authority for the 'Sale of Newspaper' Consortium'. This report considers the award of contract for the consortium.

## 2 <u>Recommendation(s)</u>

2.1 That the contract for both Lot1 (Recovered newspapers and magazines) and Lot 2 (Recovered mixed paper including tetra pak.) are awarded to Edwards Recycling Limited for an initial period of 2 years (with an optional extension of up to a further two years), commencing on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2024.

### 3 Explanation

- 3.1 This council is the Lead Authority of a consortium of local councils that collect newspaper and other papers from residents and sell the product for recycling. Other members of the consortium include:
  - Broxbourne Borough Council
  - East Hertfordshire District Council
  - North Hertfordshire District Council
  - Stevenage Borough Council
  - Chelmsford City Council
- 3.2 The current contract expires on 31<sup>st</sup> May 2024 and a tender process has been undertaken to appoint a new contractor to ensure service continuity.
- 3.3 Full details of the tender process and scores are included in the Part 2 report.
- 3.4 The tender was broken down into two Lots:
  - Lot 1 Recovered newspapers and magazines
  - Lot 2 Recovered mixed paper including tetra pak.
- 3.5 The estimated annual tonnage is:
