### REVIEW OF POLITICAL PROPORTIONALITY

# 1 Executive Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to further review the political proportionality of Member appointments to Committees, which was agreed at the Annual Council meeting on 22 May, to take account of the Hatfield Villages Ward by-election on 8 June 2017.
- 1.2 This special meeting of the Council was convened to enable this further review to take place.

### 2 Recommendation(s)

- 2.1 That the review of political proportionality of Member appointments to Committees and the proposed changes to the allocation of seats, as set out in Appendix A to the report, be approved.
- 2.2 That changes to the appointment of the membership of Committees in accordance with the revised allocation of seats, as set out in Appendix B to the report, be approved.

(Note: Appendices A and B will be published and circulated after the Hatfield Villages Ward by-election on 8 June 2017).

# 3 **Explanation**

- 3.1 The Annual Council meeting on 22 May approved the review of political proportionality of Member appointments to Committees and changes to the allocation of seats following the Panshanger Ward by-election on 4 May 2017.
- 3.2 This was a temporary review for the period up to the Hatfield Villages Ward byelection on 8 June 2017 as there is a vacant seat on the Council until then.
- 3.3 It is necessary to further review the political proportionality after the by-election when the vacancy will be filled. This will be set out in Appendix A which will be published and circulated after the by-election.
- 3.4 As the further review has to be reflected in the size and constitution of Committees, it is also necessary for changes to be made to Member appointments to Committees. These will be set out in Appendix B which will also be published and circulated after the by-election.
- 3.5 The Council has a legal duty to secure the balance of the different political groups on the authority.
