1 **Executive Summary**

- 1.1 The Council has a requirement for the secure collection of cash from various locations such as Campus West, Campus East and Car Park Machines.
- 1.2 Due to the imminent expiry of the current contract a new tender process has taken place.

2 Recommendation(s)

2.1 That a three year contract with an optional one year extension is awarded to BDI Securities (UK) Limited.

3 **Explanation**

- 3.1 There is requirement for secure cash collections from a number of council sites and from car park machines.
- 3.2 A specialist security company is required to collect, transport and arrange for the takings to be banked.
- 3.3 The procurement was undertaken using a specialist local authority framework to ensure that any bidder has the correct level of technical competence to provide the service.
- 3.4 Only one bid was received (from BDI Securities (UK) Limited). This bid met all the qualitative criteria.
