By way of introduction, Parking Services will be initially consulting with those properties that fall within the boundary of Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council (WHBC) and were included by Hertsmere Borough Council in their North Potters Bar Parking Scheme in 2014. The aim of this survey is to establish if those particular residents are either content with the restrictions as proposed by Hertsmere Borough Council, whether they wish them amended, or want something else instead.

Nb - as Resident Permit Parking Schemes are becoming increasingly popular, a fact sheet is attached for your information.

Once this information is known, those adjoining properties most likely to be affected by parking displacement will also be consulted as to whether they wish to be included in any new proposals.

By way of introduction, Parking Services have initially consulted with those properties that fell within the boundary of Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council (WHBC) and were included by Hertsmere Borough Council in their North Potters Bar Parking Scheme in 2014. The aim of that survey was to establish if those particular residents were either content with the restrictions as implemented by Hertsmere Borough Council, whether they wished them amended, or wanted something else instead. The adjoining properties, who were most likely to have been affected by any of these proposals have now also had the opportunity to express their own views.

Now the remainder of the roads in Little Heath within the WHBC boundary, not previously consulted, will receive their own survey asking if they wish to be consulted on any new restrictions for their locations. At the conclusion of this process, draft proposals will be drawn up based upon the majority of opinion from the completed survey sheets.

Finally, a new traffic regulation order based upon all the proposals will be prepared for the formal consultation stage (Notice of Intent). The Order will be advertised in the local press (date to be fixed) and all the residents and businesses in the area notified by post. Any objections should be submitted in writing once the Notice of Intent has been advertised.

Residents are invited to choose from the following types of restrictions:

Single yellow lines (limited waiting restriction), Double yellow lines (No waiting at any time), Junction Protection (yellow lines inserted at road junctions to improve safety and visibility) and Resident Permit Parking Schemes (fact sheet attached)
