1 Executive Summary

1.1 This report outlines the necessity to launch a new Transition to Net Zero Strategy (TTNZS)

- 3.1 We declared a climate emergency in 2019 and the TTNZS supports this declaration.
- 3.2 We have new corporate priorities which specifies 'Action on Climate'. The TTNZ supports these priorities, clearly setting out our vision for the borough and outlines the various ways we will take 'action on climate'.
