Annex 1 – Premises Licences – New Mandatory Conditions

If you are licensed to sell alcohol:	
A1. (on and/or off sales)	No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
A2. (on and/or off sales)	Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
A3. (on sales only)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. 2) In this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises- <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to – <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
A4. (on sales only)	The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
A5. (on and/or off sales)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The premises licence holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. 2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. 3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either- <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) a holographic mark, or b) an ultraviolet feature.

<p>A6. (on sales only)</p>	<p>The responsible person must ensure that—</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) beer or cider: ½ pint; ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
<p>A7. (on and/or off sales)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. 2) In this condition:— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) P is the permitted price, ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; b) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) the holder of the premises licence, ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. 3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. 4) Where the permitted price on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

<p>S1</p>	<p>Each individual at the licensed premises to carry out a security activity (an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act) must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act

If you are licensed to show films:	<i>Already in force</i>
F1	The admission of persons under the age of 18 to the exhibition of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation of the <i>British Board of Film Classification</i> , or, where there is no such recommendation or the licensing authority has notified the holder that section 20(3)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film, the recommendation of the licensing authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

1. There will be no provision of any adult entertainment or services, activities or other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

Conditions agreed with the Environmental Health Officer

2. Noise emanating from the premises as a result of regulated entertainment shall be inaudible when monitored at the position highlighted in yellow on the plan annexed to the licence.
3. The placing of refuse including glass into receptacles outside the premise shall not take place between 2300hrs and 0700hrs.
4. The service of late night refreshments is to cease 30 minutes prior to the closing of the premise.
5. Prominent, clear and legible notices are displayed at all exits of the building and car park requesting customers respect the residents in the area and leave quietly.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a Hearing by the Licensing Authority

1. The use of the garden area is to cease at 2300hrs.
2. The DPS or a responsible person appointed by the DPS must ensure that customers leave the premises and the area quietly, promptly within 15 minutes of closing time.
3. The occasions on which musical entertainment will take place will be limited to a maximum of 12 events in any 12 calendar month period.
4. All doors and windows to be closed at 2300hrs and at any live music event save for the purpose of access and egress.
5. The designated car park for customer parking should be for that purpose and no other use.
6. A sign must be erected at the entrance to the car park stating that it is private and for the use of the Hope and Anchor public house only.
