Notice of Objection – Permitted Temporary Activities

**On 26<sup>th</sup> September 2018 the licensing authority received from you, Shanie McGowran, a temporary event notice (“the notice”) in respect of proposed temporary licensable activities due to take place on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup> |October 2018 at Judges, 1 Judge’s Hill, Northaw. The licensing authority has received an objection under section 104(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Act”).**

A licensing hearing is being arranged to determine this application. We will write separately advising of the date and time of this hearing.

Under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, a person commits an offence if he carries on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation; or if he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on. A person convicted of such an offence is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to both.
